*"The UN has been a catalyst in the promotion of the rights of the disabled it has established an International Day on behalf of the disabled since 1992, when the General Assembly recognized the International Day of Disabled Persons, changing its name to the present one in 2007. It was also in 2007 that the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities opened for signature. "Entering into force in 2008, the Convention recognizes the barriers disabled people face are a central component of their respective disabilities and, because of that, it says that disabled people have fundamental rights to both accessibility and inclusion. ...more than two thirds of UN Member States, have ratified the Convention. "**The UN is a reminder of the immense potential it has to build a better world for all of us as it has done it with concrete deeds for more than one billion people – about 15 per cent of the world's population – live with some form of disability...Thus, the UN fight against polio which has led to its 99% worldwide eradication as of today, the illness that changed my life forever. For this is just two of the UN greatest accomplishment of its glorious 70 years...We should all continue to support the UN as we have done during 70 years of making our world a better place to live."***

Since the original publication in 2009, they have become a highly popular and versatile outreach tool. The cards are frequent travel companions of the Secretary-General and other UN senior officials; they have been translated into local languages by UN Information Centres and are adapted by partners such as the UN Foundation for their own outreach work on behalf of the UN. Many UN staff members carry a card or two with them, as auto motivational tools, or to have a quick answer ready when asked: **"So what does the United Nations actually do?"** Share the UN's message. DID YOU KNOW ? WHAT IS POLIO?

Polio, or poliomyelitis, The term poliomyelitis is from the Greek *poliós* meaning "grey", *myelós* referencing the spinal cord, and *-itis* meaning inflammation. attacks motor neurons in the spinal cord and causes paralysis in arms and legs. Many people with nonparalytic polio are able to make a full recovery, while those with paralytic polio generally end up with permanent paralysis which attacks the body's nervous system and can result in irreversible paralysis. It is spread in places with poor hygienic conditions and principally affects young people and children. There is no cure for Polio, but an effective vaccination does exist, which is administered in various doses during childhood. Strategic Alliances by Governments, United Nations, NGOs, IGOs, Public and Private Foundations worldwide & Global campaigns against Polio have reduced the cases of the disease by 99%. In 1988 the disease killed or paralyzed nearly 350,000 people throughout the world, while in 2010 less than 1,500 cases were reported. Even so, the disease persists in **Pakistan, Afghanistan, and Nigeria where polio still endemic**.
