IIMSAM'S ACTING DEPUTY-SECRETARY-GENERAL H.E. MR. MUAYAD KAFESHA IN SUPPORT OF THE IIMSAM-MANDATE & THE UN SDGS DECADE OF ACTION-2020-2030 MAKING IN ROADS TOWARDS THE INSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENT OF IIMSAM IN TANZANIA & ZANZIBAR. AS HE MEETS WITH LEADERS OF BOTH STATES FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A SPIRULINA PROGRAMME TO COMBAT MALNUTRITION.



IIMSAM'S Acting Deputy-Secretary-General **H.E. Mr. Muayad Kafesha** met in a soujourn meetings with Prime Minister of Tanzania depicted on upper (left Photo) **H.E. Mr. Kassim Majaliwa** in his office. H.E. Kafesha also met in Zanzibar with its President (Photo on the upper right.) **H.E. Mr. Hussein Mwinyi**, both of these meetings, discussed cooperation to facilitate the roadmap to implement in a partnership with the appropriate Governmental Sector, implement a Spirulina Starting Pilot-Project for 90 days 10K in Tanzania 10k in Zanzibar malnourished children from underprivileged communities. The program can scale up to 60k children for each State as appropriate **during the U.N. Decade of Action 2020-2030**. The Spirulina is free for distribution under the IIMSAM-DXN Worldwide Campaign to distribute **"Free Spirulina"** to **1 Million children and others from underprivileged communities worldwide to support the U.N. Decade of Action 2020-2030**.



Comments by the Secretary-General H.E. Remigio Maradona:



"We believe these formal discussions with Tanzania and Zanzibar will be the first step in establishing a long-lasting relationship between the Autonomous Intergovernmental institutions for the use of microalgae Spirulina Against Malnutrition, IIMSAM - Tanzania and Zanzibar simultaneously to implement IIMSAM's Roadmap to deliver Spirulina humanitarian assistance to both of these great States. "His Excellency Kafesha has done a tremendous job thus far in action oriented advocacy. I have designated His Excellency Mr. Kafesha to coordinate the roadmap towards the institutional development of IIMSAM in Tanzania and Zanzibar. As well as the free spirulina distribution and the imperative logistical support from these governments in terms of waiving custom duties and easy processing of the spirulina cargo without bottlenecks that would impede its distribution to the needy in underprivileged distribution sectors. The program is for 90 days at the end of the 90 days, the government must arrange a medical team to examine the beneficiaries to see the program's results as to any improvement of their health. Priorities sites for spirulina distribution should be given to orphanages. The distribution must be carried out by the department of health or any other governmental agencies designated by the government in cooperation with IIMSAM.

DID YOU KNOW?

- One in six children age 24-35 months is severely stunted. Stunting is higher in Tanzania Mainland (35 percent) than in Zanzibar (24 percent). ... Stunting is attributed to a combination of factors, including maternal malnutrition, inadequate infant feeding practices, low quality of health care, and poor hygiene. (Source-Unicef.)
- The United Nations Sustainable Development Goals have given participating organizations a deadline of 2030 to meet several ambitious targets, including Zero Hunger. After several years of increasing global hunger levels, Covid-19-Pandemic Year 2020 has only made the path to Zero Hunger an even steeper one.
